the score is tied at the expiration of the regular playing time, after a rest period of three minutes an extra period of three minutes will be played. If the score is still tied, alternate rest periods of three minutes and extra playing periods of three minutes shall continue. The team which is ahead at the expiration of any extra period shall be the winners. Any team which refuses to play off a tie game shall have the game forfeited to its opponent by the referee. Extra periods shall be construed to be continuation of the second half."

Item (9) A school may permit its basketball teams to enter only such tournaments as have been authorized according to the rules and regulations of the Georgia High School Association.


