My name is David Bell. I am the Athletic Director at Baconton Community Charter School. We presently have 232 students in grades 9-12. The previous coach elected to play a non-region schedule because of the size of some of the schools in the region. I have sent this email to several schools our size and it has been met with positive responses. The problem is not scheduling larger schools or competing with schools during the regular season, but there is a competitive advantage. The small schools that I have talked to want to continue to play 11-man football but find it difficult to maintain especially against larger schools in single A. A school with 400 can in theory can compete with a school with 600 easier than a school with 200 can compete with a school with 400. I attached a proposal and how Florida, Alabama, and Tennessee handles the number issue. The difference between smallest and largest school in each class should grow as the class increases. There should be a bigger number differential in 4A than in 1A. I think this would help schools like Stewart and Calhoun continue to play 11-man football, softball, and spring sports.

- <u>All other sports</u>: all schools, two classes, split by set enrollments (A: 0-450, AA: 451+)

All associations are trying to are trying to look after the small rural systems in their association.

In single A now the discrepancy between the largest and smallest school is larger than any class except 7A. The difference is almost 500 students which would equate to 250 more boy or girl athletes. Stewart County has 106 students total and they are in a class with Dublin at 548. Stewart has 53 boys to choose from and Dublin has 274. That's a large discrepancy.
